#### A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Ones,

I suggested at the beginning of Lent that we have already given up so many things over the last year - that maybe we didn't need to give up anything else, and I didn't!

Instead, I am taking on something new for each of the 8 weeks from Easter to Pentecost. I would love it if you would join me! What I am taking on is largely inspired by members of our congregation – all passionate about creation care: One is a landscape artist. Another is a daughter and granddaughter of farmers who grows fresh vegetables for our friends at Operation Hope, along with a team of youth and adults, many also from First Church. Another is an owner of a native plant nursery here in Fairfield. Another is a bee-keeper and butterfly-raiser who releases hundreds of butterflies from her own backyard. Through them I have learned about the opportunities for making a difference in the world through our choices of plants in our own backyards. I have decided to plant a new species in my own yard that supports biodiversity each week and then watch for the birds and butterflies to return to my yard. If you want to learn more you can read about the Backyard National Park or read Nature's Best Hope: A New Approach to Conservation that Starts in Your Own Backyard, by Douglas W. Tallamy.

A couple of us gathered at church last week to make "seed-bombs" for milkweed and wildflower seeds in the Garden of Hope. A seed-bomb, as one put it, means packing a lunch for the seed you are going to plant to make sure it has everything it needs. Next week, the High Road (senior high youth group) and confirmation class will be scattering most of them around the church and each taking one home to add to their own backyards. If you want one, give me a call and I will save one for you!

You could think about this project in spiritual terms – being "co-creators" with God, caring for the world God so loves, being stewards of the land entrusted to you for a time, and participating in ecological flourishing as the landscape provides a network for monarch butterflies to make it all the way to Mexico, and for the bees on your wildflowers which pollinate the garden that will feed our hungry neighbors. This is God's way: love is stronger than death, new life is always possible, and you are invited to join in the celebration God has already prepared for you!


Call a church member and see how you can take this on together! There are many experts among us if you need advice!


