Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Welcome to December, which has been called "The Most Wonderfully Holy Time of the Year" by journalist Nancy Haught in The Oregonian.

That's right. December encompasses not only the Jewish holiday Hanukkah and the Christian celebration of Christmas, but also includes spiritually significant holy-days for Muslims (Ashura), Buddhists (Bodhi Day), Pagans (Winter Solsitice), and Zoroastrians (Death of Zarathustra), as well as the Pan-African celebration of Kwanzaa. More than twelve in all! As we go about our daily lives we come into contact with many people of different traditions and faiths, or of no faith, whether we are aware or not.

The name tags have on the back the age of the family member, their sizes and any wish items they might have mentioned if cost appropriate. Thank you again for your help.



## Interfaith Refugee Resettlement and CIRI

This past few months have been an busy time for the Welcome the Stranger committee. Thousands of Afghan evacuees have started to make their way to their final US homes, and many of them are resettling here in CT. At First Church, we are fortunate that we have many ways we can serve.

Through the **Interfaith Refugee Resettlement Committee**, we continue to support our cosponsored Afghan family of 11, who are settled in their Black Rock apartments and beginning their new lives in CT. Our coalition members are busy enrolling the children in school, helping the family with health screening, clothes shopping, and getting ready for employment. There is much work to be done and many passionate coalition members willing to do it.

First Church also continues to support **CIRI (Connecticut Institute of Refugees and Immigrants)** by setting up apartments for their clients as they settle in the community. Today First Church worked alongside church members from Norfield Congregational, the Unitarian Church in Westport, and Greenfield Hill Congregational to set up an apartment for 6 Afghan men in Hamden. The landlord, himself an Afghan who immigrated to Connecticut in 2018, had the house on the market but decided to rent it when approached by CIRI.
