Ban these books! Sex, Violence, Heroism, Betrayal, Warfare, Greed, Lust, Life and Death, and Faith. It's all there in the books of 1 and 2 Samuel--the conflicts, jealousies, victories and failures which make for the most exquisitely narrated narratives in all of Scripture. It's surprising that someone hasn't tried to ban them from the public library. Not yet, anyway.

Over six weeks, we'll be introduced to a period of massive social, economic, and political change in the life of ancient Israel; however, the books of Samuel don't view these changes through a wide lens, rather, we see particular characters up close and personal as they struggle through them. In our six weeks together we will consider how they respond to, benefit from, or exploit the changes they face. Their stories may teach us something about our own complex struggles in this day as we ponder how God is present, and how we might respond to that presence in a time of bewildering change.
