Spollett Retires after 38 Years of Ministry, Teaching at Fairfield University, Co-Founding Operation Hope and Partnering on the Annual Holocaust Memorial

Fairfield – First Church Congregational of Fairfield, Conn., is honored to announce the retirement of the Rev. David W. Spollett, Senior Pastor, after 38 years of ordained ministry, all served at First Church. A celebration of his decades of service and profound impact on our community will take place on Sunday, June 5, 2022, at a festive worship service at 10:15 AM in the sanctuary, followed by a gala luncheon with live entertainment on the church grounds. All are welcome to join us in commemorating this significant transition for our pastor, congregation, and town.

A major figure in the Fairfield community, David has served as a pastor of First Church for his entire career, ministering to the people of Fairfield and greater Bridgeport, teaching and serving at Fairfield University, mentoring a generation of new pastors, co-founding Operation Hope – a local non-profit offering short term and long term solutions to hunger and homelessness in the Fairfield-Bridgeport area, and being an integral part of other ecumenical and interfaith partnerships – including the town's annual Holocaust Memorial.

Since he began his ministry at First Church in 1984, David and his wife Geri have become integral parts of the community. In addition to ministering to the congregation of First Church, David has served the community in countless ways, including longtime service as the Protestant chaplain and an adjunct faculty member at Fairfield University, in addition to teaching at the University of Bridgeport and Yale Divinity School. David has influenced a generation of new clergy through years of mentoring seminarians at First Church. Geri Spollett, an Adult Nurse Practitioner and Certified Diabetes Educator, retired several years ago after a 28 year career at Yale University where she was the Associate Director of the Diabetes Center.

With Rabbi Leon Waldman, David co-founded Operation Hope in 1984 after encountering a man sleeping in the church; this organization continues to provide hunger relief and housing assistance to our community, having effectively ended homelessness within the town of Fairfield. David has also been an integral part of the town's annual Holocaust memorial, held at First Church each April. He has also been a leader of the Fairfield Clergy Association and shepherded First Church's partnership with an African-American congregation, First Baptist Church, Stratford. In 1994, Spollett led First Church to declare itself an Open and Affirming congregation for all people regardless of race, class, ancestry, gender identity, marital status, ability or sexual orientation. His other outreach efforts have included work with the Mercy Learning Center, Project Learn, Merton House, Habitat for Humanity and Rebuilding Together in Greater Bridgeport.

Please join us in celebrating David's retirement and giving David and Geri our best wishes in their next phase of life.


Church, please join me in welcoming our new Social Media Specialist!

# Update on First Church Renovations

#### Eunoia Room

Painting of the Eunoia Room will start on Monday, June 6, and take approximately 3 weeks. Other plans for the Eunoia Room include updating the chandelier and furniture.

#### Eunoia Room Kitchen

Kitchen cabinets, appliances and floor tile have been ordered and once received Tom Kane will be doing a complete renovation...hopefully also in June.

#### Jones Wing

Renovation of two bathrooms in the Jones Wing is happening in May to insure time for accreditation approval before school starts in September. We are also repairing the Beach Road doors in the Jones Wing and installing a push door, as per accreditation needs, in place of one of the sliding doors in the library. Montessori is installing new windows in Hobart Chapel with clear divided glass and also adding child level sinks in the library and in Hobart Chapel. All of this should be completed by mid-June

The new roof and new Store air conditioning has been completed at a cost of \$88K and \$11K. \$100K was budgeted so right on target.

#### The Store

Conversion of the Jones Wing current Toddler Room to a receiving and staging space and the Toddler bathroom to an adult bathroom all for the Store is planned to take place in July/August. The Store is also looking to upgrade their main entrance doors and temperature control around their windows.

#### The Children's Chapel

This room is pretty much completed except for carpeting. We would love some input on furnishing this room in the best way possible to be used for meetings. It is currently furnished for a small service, but the folding chairs could be easily put aside when more meeting space is needed. Any ideas?

# Music Room/Meeting Room/Infant Room

The current elementary classroom in the connecting corridor will be converted to two mutipurpose rooms hopefully this summer. More information on this will be discussed at the All-Church Annual Meeting on May 24.

## Sunnieholme Parsonage

The Spolletts are moving out on July 6 and plans are to do very minor renovations, as needed, and rent the space as soon as possible. We'd like to rent for a year and then have a discussion on the best future use of the parsonage. First floor refinishing and a new coat of paint on the entire interior is called for and at some point a new roof, new windows and and a new driveway are needed if we keep the property.

## 636 Old Post Road

With Operation Hope indicating their desire for new, larger space due to their required move out of Nichols Street and the limitations on our space by the Historic District Commission, The Gaelic American Club's 501c-3 organization set up for the Irish Famine Museum is very interested in renting or owning the space and doing major renovations. This is probably 2-3 years down the road and is dependent on Operation Hope finding new space.

# Senior Pastor Office

You will see some painting and floor refinishing going on in the Senior Pastor's office over the next couple of months in preparation for our new Senior Pastor's move from upstairs to downstairs.

### Sanctuary Bells

Final installation of the new Bell head bolts and strikers and the new clock and new hands will begin on June 1 and could take as long as five days.
