Dear Sisters and Brothers,

"Joy is the infallible sign of the presence of God."

As we draw ever closer to Christmas Day (I write this on December 15; you will probably receive it after Christmas) my mind and heart keep going back to this quote from Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, a Jesuit priest, paleontologist, theologian, and philosopher who died in 1955 at the age of 73.

Each Sunday in Advent we have focused on a different theme or spiritual truth: hope, peace, joy, and love. This year I have been deeply struck by the power of joy. The essential nature of joy in Christian life.

I have decided to give myself something for Christmas this year. Starting now and throughout all the New Year, I will be giving myself the spiritual discipline of always looking for joy. Joy is not the denial of the hard realities of life. It is not banal jollity in the face of evil. It is a gift which comes with the presence of God.It is the recognition that we are not alone in this world that God in Jesus is with us. Always. With. Us.

It has been my joy to serve as one of your pastors for most of my adult life. It has been a joy because you have always known and exhibited your knowledge of God's presence in your commitment to being a Servant Church. In the care and compassion you extend to each other in times of trouble. In your dedication to our beloved church.

So, let's be a joyful people in the year ahead. Let our joy overflow, because we know the angel's song is true,

Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah,the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.



# WELCOME THE STRANGER

## Interfaith Refugee Resettlement and CIRI

This past few months have been an busy time for the Welcome the Stranger committee. Thousands of Afghan evacuees have started to make their way to their final US homes, and many of them are resettling here in CT. At First Church, we are fortunate that we have many ways we can serve.

Through the Interfaith Refugee Resettlement Committee, we continue to support our cosponsored Afghan family of 11, who are settled in their Black Rock apartments and beginning their new lives in CT. Our coalition members are working to support the boys in their new school, helping the family with health screening, clothes shopping, resume building, interview prep, and getting ready for employment. There is much work to be done and many passionate coalition members willing to do it.

First Church also continues to support CIRI (Connecticut Institute for Refugees and Immigrants) by setting up apartments for their clients as they settle in the community. In November and December, First Church worked alongside partner church members to setup 17 apartments (to date) to refugees from Afghanistan and the Democratic Republic of Congo. These setups are happening in rapid succession – 1 week in December had 3 separate arrivals. For each setup, First Church provides supplies and people power to wash the floors, make the beds, and fill the cupboards. In addition, our church coalition has also worked to gather the furniture needed – lamps, dressers, end tables, etc – and store it for CIRI, saving CIRI staff time.

You can donate the supplies that First Church provides each setup – including First Aid kits, welcome mats, paper blinds, kitchen mats, and clock radios. Full list of supplies and where to deliver them can be found at

## The Gift of Opportunity!

As you may know, Interfaith Refugee Resettlement Committee (IRRC), a community coalition of seven faith-based organizations in our area, was formed in October with the purpose of resettling Afghan refugees in Bridgeport, CT. In November we welcomed an extended family of 11, including father, mother, five adult daughters (ages 18-28), a son in-law (34), and three children (ages 8, 5 and 18mos). The father had a senior position with a women's rights organization, and helped coordinate government activities in Jalalabad and the east. He has the scars to show for it (literally)! The young adults are sophisticated, educated and, yes, bi-lingual. They were HR and Communications professionals, Teachers, Doctors in training, and College students. While not directly assisting the US Military or State Dept, their efforts contributed indirectly to standing up and strengthening a fledgling democracy. Earning them the wrath of the Taliban.

Their stories are heartwarming, and at the same time, heart breaking. Yet we see in them the combination of kindness, compassion, courage, resourcefulness and resiliency that will help them build a brighter future for themselves, and enhance the communities in which they live. Indeed, four received Certificates of Appreciation from Ft Dix, where they lived from late August to early November, for contributing to the broader resettlement effort by assisting the US Airforce, the CDC, IOM and DHS as teachers and interpreters.

We are grateful for the many that have already helped with their contributions of time, talent and money. But as these young adults take their first steps forward, your help in aiding their search for employment could be the very best gift you give this holiday season.

#### What's next for them? They need jobs!

They have substantial resumes, impressive recommendations, speak multiple languages (fluency in English, Pashto, Dari and Urdu), and are eager to work. Their professional experiences span HR, Finance, Communications and Administration with provincial government and major international NGOs, Teaching (elementary and middle school), and healthcare services. All are computer literate and proficient in Microsoft Office.

# Pastoral Search Committee Update

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The interim pastor search committee is continuing its work to ensure a successful transition in our pastoral leadership following David's retirement and the termination of the existing co-pastorate with David and Vanessa effective September 1.

As previously shared, Vanessa has expressed her strong interest in serving as our next Senior Pastor, and we have sought guidance from the Southern New England Conference of the UCC with respect to conducting a pastoral search when a qualified internal candidate has expressed such interest. Associate Conference Minister Michael Ciba has assured us that our situation is not without precedent, and the Conference has an established protocol for dealing with it. It is Rev. Ciba's recommendation that we singularly discern on Vanessa's candidacy before commencing a search involving external candidates. In other words, the Conference believes it would be in the interest of First Church to determine whether to call Vanessa to be our Senior Pastor before engaging with external candidates. That means if the Congregation decides to call Vanessa following a period of discernment, there would be no need for an external search. The search committee has decided to defer to this precedent and follow the recommendation of the Conference.

Vanessa has expressed her support for a period of discernment with respect to her candidacy and has worked with the search committee to plan opportunities for the congregation to hear from her directly with respect to her vision for First Church. There will also be opportunities for dialogue and for questions to be posed to both Vanessa and the committee.



### Pastor Search Committee Update (cont.)

We believe this process will enable the committee to make a recommendation with respect to Vanessa's candidacy in a timely manner. If the recommendation is to call Vanessa and the congregation approves, then she will be in place as of September 1. If the recommendation is to consider external candidates, then it will be necessary to retain an interim pastor by September 1.

There will be additional communications in January with respect to the continuing discernment process and the scheduling of specific events. Please take advantage of these opportunities to learn more about Vanessa's candidacy and her vision for First Church and to share your opinions with the committee so that an informed decision can be made with respect to our future leadership.
