I agree this time is a rich opportunity to envision news ways of living together as the "Beloved Community."

But one thing will remain the same: the joy of being together! I cannot wait to join you – physically – in a joyful summer of worship!

To repeat what I said earlier, "When I think of you, my heart is glad and my soul rejoices!" So true.


