
Covenant to Care Easter Basket Signups

This is the 51st year for our local interfaith CROP Hunger Walk in the Bridgeport area. It is the Community Appeal of Church World Service. It fights hunger, locally, nationally and internationally, and emphasizes self-sustaining agricultural practices. 75% of the money collected will be used by Church World Service projects and 25% remains here supporting 11 local agencies that support our vulnerable neighbors here in the Greater Bridgeport area. Contributions are tax deductible.

Agencies we are helping this year are: in Bridgeport, Bridgeport Rescue Mission, Daughters of Charity Rescue Mission, Inc., King's Pantry, Thomas Merton Center's "Eat Smart Marketplace", Nourish Bridgeport, in Fairfield, Operation Hope Food Pantry & Meals, in Stratford, Stratford Baptist Church Shepherds Food Pantry, in Trumbull, Trumbull Social Services, in Shelton, Spooner House, in Monroe, Monroe Food Pantry, and in Milford, Beth El Center.


