Pastor's Letter

When I go back “home” this month to share a Thanksgiving meal in the house I grew up in, surrounded by my family: my parents and children, siblings, nieces and nephews I will have so much for which to be grateful. When we gather around the table, I know that the grace my father will pray will include the line, as it always does, “keep us ever mindful of the needs of others.”

As we enter this season of thanks, I am grateful for the kindness and caring that radiates from our church family. One of the greatest joys in being the Pastor of First Church is seeing your faithful generosity to those in need and all the ways you are truly “ever mindful.”

As many of our friends and neighbors deal with increasing levels of anxiety around meeting their most basic needs, particularly those that relate to feeding themselves and their families as SNAP benefits are frozen, our pastoral team has heard from many of you expressing concern. Your generosity of spirit is inspiring.

First, if you are in need, never hesitate to reach out to me for support from the Deacon's Emergency Assistance Fund. This will be given in confidence to sustain you in times of difficulty.

If you are able to support the wider community, here are some of the ways you can help that are already in place:

1) Please continue to help stock the blessing box on Beach Road that Eagle Scout Joseph Drew built for us. Just change your route home from the grocery store to share a few items each week! Shelf stable, nutritious food is most needed!

2) On Nov. 15, we've offered our parking lot to our friends at Operation HOPE as community leaders host a food drive. Details follow in this issue. We hope you'll consider heading over here with a full trunk of groceries to share! Let's stock the shelves!

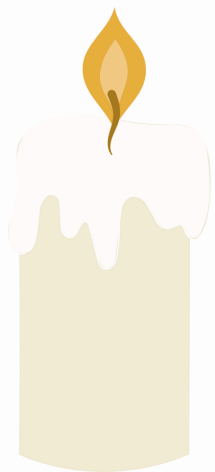

4) Gather in the First Church Kitchen Thursdays at 3p.m. to join volunteers with our partners at nOURish Bridgeport and help prepare and serve the Feel the Warmth Meal! (more info inside) Since August we have prepared over 3,000 meals with this ministry!

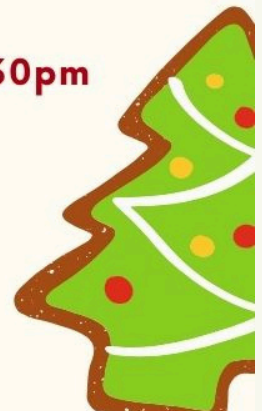
