A Message from the Pastor



Supporting our Friends at Congregation B’Nai Israel

On Christmas Eve, our friends in the local Jewish community who worship at Congregation B’Nai Israel on Park Avenue in Bridgeport, experienced a devastating act of Antisemitic hate. The synagogue’s menorrah, a sacred Jewish symbol central to the celebration of Hannukah, had been vandalized by someone who deliberately pushed it over. Rabbi Evan Schultz, my friend and the congregation’s spiritual leader, wrote eloquently about these heartbreaking events on his personal Facebook page in a message to his congregation. His poignant and thoughtful message included this:

“When one of our fellow synagogues is attacked, we all suffer. As our tradition teaches, kol Yisrael areivim zeh ba-zeh. All Jews are interconnected. It is through this connection that we continue to find hope. It is through our friendship and fellowship that we draw strength. May we all live to see better days and an end to hate. This is what keeps me hopeful. We are stronger together”



Pastor's Message (continued)



Our bonds with congregation B’Nai Israel have been strong for decades and continue today through many touchstones, including our Interfaith Book Group (which I encourage you to consider joining) and the annual Holocaust Memorial we have hosted in our sanctuary for more than four decades.

Shortly after this act of vandalism, I reached out to Rabbi Schultz to personally express my sympathy and support for him and his congregation.

We hope the people of B’Nai Israel have found comfort in the thoughtful messages they have received from a diverse array of local congregations and community leaders, who have rightly condemned the desecration of a religious symbol at a time when the Jewish community has experienced a frightening escalation of Antisemitism, acts of extreme violence and aggression.

If you personally know a member of the congregation, I encourage you to check in on them and offer your thoughts and prayers.

In the New Year, let us pray together for a kinder world.

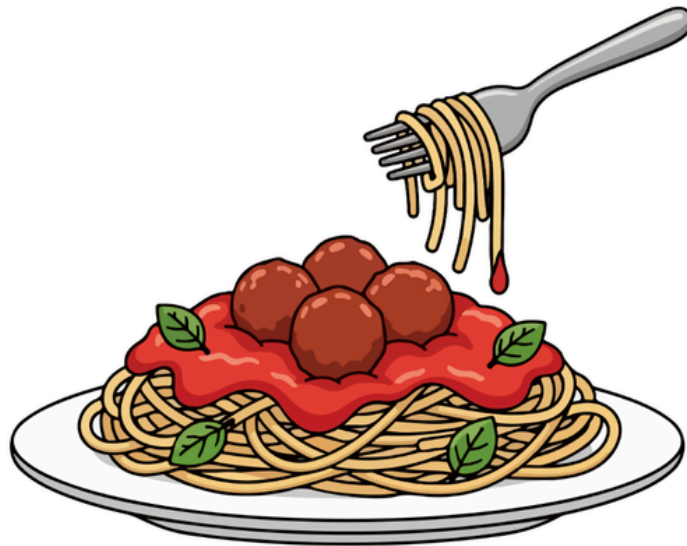
